THE APPEALS CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (hereinafter “the International Tribunal”),

NOTING Milan Vujin’s Request for extension of time limit filed in English on 23 March 2001 (hereinafter “the Request”),

NOTING the Judgement of the Appeals Chamber dated 27 February 2001 upholding the allegations of contempt against Milan Vujin and ordering him to pay a fine of Dfl 15,000,

CONSIDERING that in his Request Milan Vujin asks the Appeals Chamber for the time limit to be extended by 8 days in order to pay the fine,

CONSIDERING that, through a letter dated 29 March 2001, Milan Vujin informed the Registrar that he had paid the outstanding fine,

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS,

STATES that there is no longer any reason to rule on the Request.
