**WARRANT OF ARREST
ORDER FOR SURRENDER**

To: The Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro)

I, Patricia Wald, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“International Tribunal”),

PURSUANT to United Nations Security Council Resolution 827 of 25 May 1993, Articles 19(2) and 29 of the Statute of the International Tribunal (“Statute”) and Rules 54 to 61 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal (“Rules”);

NOTING the indictment brought against MOMČILO GRUBAN also known as “Čkalja” by the Prosecutor and confirmed by a Judge of the International Tribunal on 2 June 1998 (“Indictment”), a copy of which is annexed to this warrant of arrest;

CONSIDERING that, pursuant to rule 55 (D) of the Rules, the Registrar may, subject to any order of a Judge or Chamber, transmit a certified copy of a warrant of arrest to, *inter alia*, the national authorities of a State in whose territory or under whose jurisdiction the accused resides, or was last known to be, or is believed by the Registrar to be likely to be found;

HEREBY DIRECT the authorities of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) to search for, arrest and surrender to the International Tribunal:


MOMČILO GRUBAN, also known as “Čkalja”, born on 19 June 1961 in Marička, Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Alleged to have committed between about 24 May and 30 August 1992 in the Opština Prijedor in the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina in the territory of the former Yugoslavia, the following crimes: Grave Breaches of the Geneva Conventions 1949, Violations of Laws or Customs of War and Crimes against Humanity, within the competence of the International Tribunal by virtue of Articles 2, 3, and 5 respectively,

And to advise the said MOMČILO GRUBAN, also known as “Čkalja”, at the time of his arrest, in a language that he understands, of his rights set forth in Article 21 of the Statute and, *mutatis mutandis*, in Rules 42 and 43 of the Rules which are annexed hereto, of his right to remain silent, and to caution him that any statement he makes shall be recorded and may be used in evidence. The Indictment and review of the Indictment (and all other documents annexed to the present warrant) must also be brought to the attention of the accused;

REQUEST that, after the arrest of MOMČILO GRUBAN, also known as “Čkalja”, the authorities of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) so inform the Registrar of the International Tribunal without delay so that he may be transferred to the International Tribunal pursuant to Rule 57 of the Rules; and

REQUEST also that the authorities of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) inform the Registrar of the International Tribunal as quickly as possible if they are unable to execute this warrant of arrest and to indicate the reasons for such non-execution pursuant to Rule 59(A) of the Rules.
