THIS TRIAL CHAMBER, seized of the Prosecution's Motion for Clarification of the Scheduling Order of 25 March 2002 (the "Prosecution Motion");

NOTING the Scheduling Order issued on 25 March 2002 (the "Order");

NOTING that para. 5 of the Practice Direction on the Length of Briefs and Motions of 19 January 2001 expressly provides that "*other motions, replies and responses before a Chamber will not exceed 10 pages or 3,000 words, whichever is greater*";

NOTING that para. 5 remains unchanged in the Practice Direction on the Length of Briefs and Motions of 5 March 2002;

CONSIDERING that the written submissions of the Parties related to the Challenge of Jurisdiction are to be included in this category;

PURSUANT TO Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence,

HEREBY ORDERS that the Parties, in filing written submissions, must not exceed the limit of 10 pages or 3,000 words for each Accused as stated in para. 5 of the above mentioned Practice Directions; **AND**


CONFIRMS the Order in its remaining parts.
