Trial Chamber II, (hereinafter the “Trial Chamber”) of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“International Tribunal”);

PURSUANT TO Rule 64 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal;

CONSIDERING that the indictment was confirmed by Judge Wolfgang Schomburg on 26 March 2002;

CONSIDERING that the warrant for the arrest of **Momir Nikolić** was issued by Judge Wolfgang Schomburg on 26 March 2002;

CONSIDERING that on the basis of the warrant of arrest, the accused was arrested on 31 March 2002;


CONSIDERING that the accused was transferred to the International Tribunal and brought to the United Nations Detention Unit in The Hague on 2 April 2002;

CONSIDERING that at the initial appearance of **Momir Nikolić** on 3 April 2002, the accused stated that he will only be submitting a request for provisional release when his defence team, “is in its full composition”;

THEREFORE ORDERS the detention on remand of **Momir Nikolić** and enjoins the Commanding Officer of the United Nations Detention Unit in The Hague to detain the accused until further order; and

STATES that when asked, the accused did not request that anybody be informed of his deprivation of liberty and his ongoing detention and that presently he does not require that his embassy or consulate be informed about his deprivation of liberty and ongoing detention.
