NOTING that the Appeals Chamber is seised of the “Defence Notice of Appeal” filed by Mirolad Krnojelac on 12 April 2002 and the “Prosecution’s Notice of Appeal” filed on 15 April 2002 from the Judgement of Trial Chamber II in *Prosecutor v. Milorad Krnojelac* dated 15 March 2002 (“appeals”);

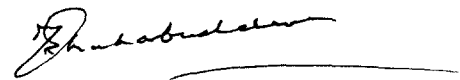

NOTING that Rule 65ter of the Rules, read together with Rule 107 of the Rules, authorises the Presiding Judge of the Appeals Chamber to designate a member of the Appeals Chamber to be responsible for pre-appeal proceedings (“the Pre-Appeal Judge”);

HEREBY DESIGNATE, with immediate effect, Judge Theodor Meron as Pre-Appeal Judge with responsibility for all pre-appeal proceedings in the appeals.
