TRIAL CHAMBER II of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for

Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former

Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal"),

NOTING that Milomir Stakić ("Accused") complained of abdominal pain to his Defence counsel

before the start of the proceedings on 7 May 2002,

NOTING that the nurse present at the International Tribunal performed an initial review of the

health of the Accused and assessed that he was not in a position to attend the proceedings for that

day,

NOTING that the Accused did not waive his right to be present during the trial and that the trial

was adjourned, pending an improvement in the health of the Accused,

CONSIDERING that the Trial Chamber considers it appropriate to review the state of health of the

Accused,

PURSUANT TO Rule 74 bis of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal,

HEREBY ORDERS that a medical examination of the accused Milomir Stakić shall be carried out

AND

INSTRUCTS that the Trial Chamber and the Parties shall be informed in writing about the status

of the health of the Accused by 12:00pm on 8 May 2002.
