TRIAL CHAMBER II ("the Chamber") of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of

Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the

Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("the Tribunal"):

BEING SEISED of the "Urgent Request for Hearing on Motion for Provisional Release" filed on

behalf of the accused Mile Mrksic ("the Accused") on 30 May 2002 ("the Motion"), requesting the

Chamber to urgently schedule the hearing on the Defence Motion for provisional release on

humanitarian grounds relating to his health,

NOTING that the Chamber by its Order dated 31 May 2002 has instructed the Head of the United

Nations Detention Unit (the "Unit") to file a report on the current medical treatment, conditions and

facilities, including any special dietary needs being provided to the Accused during his detention at

the Unit within a period of fifteen days of the receipt of the Order, to provide more complete

information to enable the Chamber to reach an informed decision on the Motion;

NOTING that by the Order dated 31 May 2002, the Chamber ordered a medical examination of the

Accused as soon as feasible and instructed the Registrar to entrust this task to experts whose names

appear on the list previously drawn up by the Registry to enable the Trial Chamber to reach an

informed decision on the Motion;

FINDING that since the Chamber has already set out a course of action dealing with the health

issues of the Accused;

PURSUANT TO Rule 54 of the Rules,

HEREBY ORDERS: that Chamber will rule upon the Motion after receiving copies of the report

of the Head of the UN Detention Unit and the Medical Report, and after hearing any further

submissions if necessary.
