THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("the International Tribunal"),

Proprio motu

NOTING the oral directions given by the Trial Chamber at a hearing held on 26 June 2002, which hearing the accused was unable to attend due to illness,


CONSIDERING the present and recent past illnesses of the accused,

HEREBY CONFIRMS and VARIES its oral orders as follows :

- (1) subject to further submissions from the accused, the Trial Chamber grants leave to the Prosecution to call the three additional witnesses currently identified as C-039, K33 and K34;
- (2) the Trial Chamber shall hear oral argument in closed session on Friday 5 July 2002 on the possible application of Rule 70 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal ("Rules") to certain prosecution witnesses;
- (3) a representative of the government concerned may be present at the hearing;
- (4) pursuant to Rule 73 *bis* of the Rules, the Trial Chamber shall hold a pre-trial conference relating to the portions of the case concerning Bosnia and Croatia on Thursday 18 July 2002;
- (5) the Prosecution shall have until Friday 26 July 2002, plus a further period of two weeks from Monday 26 August to Friday 6 September 2002, in which to present the part of the case concerning Kosovo, with leave to the Prosecution to apply to the Trial Chamber at that time for one additional week for the presentation of evidence; and

- (6) pursuant to its powers under Rule 74 *bis* of the Rules, the Trial Chamber orders a full medical examination and report of the accused and **INSTRUCTS** the Registrar of the International Tribunal to make the necessary arrangements forthwith so that a report can be made available to the Trial Chamber by Wednesday 17 July 2002.
