THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal"),

BEING SEISED of the "Prosecution's Motion for Leave to Call Isuf Jemini" filed by the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") on 2 July 2002 ("Motion"),

NOTING the Trial Chamber's Order of 11 January 2002, which provides that "written statements of all witnesses to be called in person are to be disclosed to the accused, in a language he understands, prior to the commencement of the trial; any witness whose statement has not been so disclosed may only be called with leave of the Trial Chamber",

CONSIDERING the reasons given by the Prosecution for the late inclusion of this witness,

CONSIDERING that the Trial Chamber is satisfied that it is in the interests of justice to permit the Prosecution to call the witness,

PURSUANT TO Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence,

HEREBY GRANTS the Motion seeking leave to call Mr. Isuf Jemini as a witness.
