I, Judge Richard May, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal");

HAVING BEEN DESIGNATED as duty Judge by the President of the International Tribunal pursuant to Rule 28 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal ("Rules") for the period 6 September to 13 September 2002;

PURSUANT TO United Nations Security Council Resolution 827 of 25 May 1993, and Articles 19(2) and 29 of the Statute of the International Tribunal ("the Statute") and Rules 54 to 61 of the Rules;

BEING SEISED of an application filed by the Office of the Prosecutor ("the Prosecutor") on 9 September 2002 (dated 6 September 2002) requesting a warrant of arrest and order for surrender of the accused ŽELJKO MEAKIĆ, also known as Željko Mejakić, and for an order regarding its transmission;

NOTING the amended Indictment submitted by the Prosecutor against the accused ŽELJKO MEAKIĆ, also known as Željko Mejakić, confirmed by Judge Mohamed Fassi Fihri, a Judge of the International Tribunal, on 19 July 2001, a copy of which is annexed to this warrant of arrest;

HEREBY DIRECT and authorise the Prosecutor or her representatives to search for, arrest, detain and surrender to the International Tribunal:

ŽELJKO MEAKIĆ, also known as Željko Mejakić, born on 2 August 1964 in Petrov Gaj in the municipality of Prijedor, Bosnia and Herzegovina, alleged to have committed between 24 May 1992 and 30 August 1992 in the territory of Prijedor municipality, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the following crimes: Grave Breaches of the Geneva Conventions of 1949, Violations of the Laws or Customs of War, Genocide and Crimes against Humanity, punishable under Articles 2 - 5 and 7(1) and 7(3) of the Statute of the International Tribunal;

Further **DIRECT** the Prosecutor or her representatives to advise ŽELJKO MEAKIĆ, also known as Željko Mejakić, at the time of the arrest, in a language he understands, of his rights as set forth in Article 21 of the Statute and, *mutatis mutandis*, in Rules 42 and 43 of the Rules which are annexed hereto, of his right to remain silent, and to caution him that any statement he makes shall be recorded and may be used against him in evidence. The amended Indictment and review of the Indictment (and all other documents annexed to the present warrant of arrest) must also be brought to the attention of the accused;

REQUEST the Prosecutor or her representatives, upon the arrest of ŽELJKO MEAKIĆ, also known as Željko Mejakić, to promptly notify the Registrar of the International Tribunal so that the accused may be transferred to the International Tribunal pursuant to Rule 57 of the Rules;

REQUEST the Prosecutor or her representatives to report forthwith to the Registrar of the International Tribunal if they are unable to execute this warrant of arrest and to indicate the reasons for such non-execution.
