THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“International Tribunal”);

BEING SEIZED of a pleading entitled “Prosecution Motion for Variation from Page Limits” dated 16 October 2002;

NOTING THAT the Practice Direction on the Length of Briefs and Motions¹ dated 5 March 2002 (“Practice Direction”) provides that “The pre-trial briefs will not exceed 50 pages or 15,000 words, whichever is greater”;

NOTING THAT pursuant to the Practice Direction, “a party must seek authorization in advance from the Chamber to exceed the page limits in this Practice Direction and must provide an explanation of the exceptional circumstances that necessitate the oversized filing”;


NOTING THAT the Prosecution anticipates that its Pre-Trial Brief will require not more than one hundred seventy-five (175) pages;

CONSIDERING THAT the justification put forward by the Prosecution, addressing the facts and legal issues concerning four accused at the same time, constitutes an exceptional circumstance that allows for the oversized filing;

HEREBY GRANTS leave as requested and will accept the Prosecution’s filing of its Pre-Trial Brief.
