THE APPEALS CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“International Tribunal”),


NOTING the Scheduling Order issued on 31 October 2002, ordering that a hearing be held on 21 November 2002 (“Scheduling Order”);

CONSIDERING that the parties have been ordered to present oral argument limited to the issue of whether the clearly admissible evidence identified in the Scheduling Order justifies a new trial by a Trial Chamber, on some or all of the counts;

HEREBY ORDERS the following:

1. The hearing shall commence at 2.30 p.m. in Courtroom I on Thursday, 21 November 2002.
2. The Prosecution is granted 75 minutes for its submissions.
3. The Appellant is granted 75 minutes for its submissions.
4. The Prosecution is granted 30 minutes to reply.
5. The Appellant is granted 30 minutes to reply.
