PURSUANT TO Rules 54 and 86 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal;


DECIDES that the Schedule in this case will be as follows:

- 1) The parties shall file their Final Trial Briefs no later than 16 April 2003. The maximum length of the final trial briefs shall not exceed 300 pages in total;
- 2) The closing arguments of the parties shall take place on 6, 7 and 8 May 2003, with the following sitting hours: 9:00-13:45. Each party will be given five hours to deliver its closing argument; each party will be allotted respectively 30 minutes for its rebuttal or rejoinder argument.
