TRIAL CHAMBER II (“Trial Chamber”) of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”):

NOTING the confidential “Application under Rule 15 for Disqualification and Withdrawal of Judges Agius, Janu and Taya” (“Application”), filed by counsel for the Respondent on 4 May 2004, in which the Respondent applies under Rule 15 for the disqualification and withdrawal of Judges Agius, Janu and Taya from the trial of the contempt proceedings brought against the Respondent;

NOTING this Trial Chamber’s “Scheduling Order”, filed on 8 June 2004, revoking the Scheduling Order of 18 May 2004, in which the Defence case in these proceedings had been set to commence on 14 June 2004, because the Application was still pending;

NOTING the “Decision on Application for Disqualification”, filed on 11 June 2004, in which the Bureau dismisses the Application and affirms that the case may be held by this Trial Chamber as presently composed;

CONSIDERING that both the *amicus curiae* Prosecutor and Counsel for the Respondent Milka Maglov have communicated to the Trial Chamber that other commitments do not permit them to be in The Hague prior to 19 July 2004;

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS

PURSUANT TO Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence;

HEREBY ORDERS as follows:


1. Proceedings shall resume on Tuesday 20 July 2004 at 14:15 hours;
2. The Defence will be given a maximum of three trial days to present its case;
3. Final briefs from both parties shall be filed on 27 July 2004 by 16.00 hours; and
4. Closing arguments shall be heard on 29 July 2004.
