I, Alphons Orié, Pre-Trial Judge in Trial Chamber I (“the Chamber”) at the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”);

NOTING the Order of the President of the Tribunal of 5 April 2004 assigning the case *The Prosecutor vs. Jadranko Prlić, Bruno Stojić, Slobodan Praljak, Milivoj Petković, Valentin Ćorić and Berislav Pušić*, (IT-04-74-I) to Trial Chamber I;

NOTING the Presiding Judge’s Order of 5th April 2004 to designate me as Pre-Trial Judge in the case;

NOTING that the initial appearance of the accused Jadranko Prlić, Bruno Stojić, Slobodan Praljak, Milivoj Petković, Valentin Ćorić and Berislav Pušić (“the Accused”) took place on 6 April 2004;

NOTING the six Requests for provisional release filed by the Accused in this case;¹

NOTING the Prosecutor’s Responses to all six Requests for provisional release;²

NOTING the Replies to the Prosecutor’s Responses, filed by the Accused Prlić, Ćorić, Pušić and Praljak;

CONSIDERING that while Jadranko Prlić, Bruno Stojić, Slobodan Praljak, Milivoj Petković and Valentin Ćorić sought in their requests to be provisionally released to the Republic of Croatia, they also attached letters from the Federal Government of Bosnia and Hercegovina with guarantees that the Federal Government would comply with all measures ordered by the Chamber, including the obligation to ensure that the Accused will appear for trial;

CONSIDERING that, in his request, Berislav Pušić seeks to be provisionally released to the Federation of Bosnia and Hercegovina, in support of which he attaches a letter from the Federal Government of Bosnia and Hercegovina with guarantees that the Federal Government would comply with all measures ordered by the Chamber, including the obligation to ensure that Berislav Pušić will appear for trial;

NOTING the Motions filed on 14th July 2004 by Valentin Ćorić and Berislav Pušić Requesting the Hearing of the Representative of the Government of the Federation Bosnia and Hercegovina in Order to Decide on the Application for Provisional Release (“the Motions”);

PURSUANT to Rules 54, 62, 65 and 65*bis* of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence;

HEREBY grant the Motions filed on 14th July 2004;


INFORM the Federal Government of Bosnia and Hercegovina that a Status Conference has been scheduled for Monday 19 July 2004 at 14:30 hours in Courtroom III in the presence of the Accused and their Defence Counsels;

INFORM the Federal Government of Bosnia and Hercegovina that a hearing to address the Motions for Provisional Release of the Accused will be held in immediate continuation of the Status Conference scheduled for Monday 19 July 2004 at 14:30 hours in Courtroom III;

INVITE the Federal Government of Bosnia and Hercegovina to present directly to the Chamber, either in writing before Monday, 19 July 2004, or orally by attending the scheduled hearing on that day, its confirmation of the written guarantees submitted by the accused, including the obligation that the accused, if provisionally released into the territory of that government, will appear for trial.
