# DECISION ON PROSECUTION REQUEST TO EXCEED PAGE LIMIT FOR PRE-TRIAL BRIEF

THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons

Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory

of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal"),

BEING SEISED OF a "Prosecution Request to Exceed Page Limit for Pre-Trial Brief" filed on

12 July 2004 ("Motion") by the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution"), requesting authorisation

from the Trial Chamber to exceed the page limit of the Prosecution pre-trial brief, specifically

seeking "permission to file a pre-trial brief of no more than 100 pages," 1

NOTING the (i) "Defence Response to the Prosecution Request to Exceed Page Limit for Pre-Trial

Brief and Request for Extension Time-Limit to File Defence Pre-Trial Brief" filed on 13 July 2004

by the Defence of Jovica Stanišić; and (ii) "Defence Response to the Prosecution Request to

Exceed Page Limit for Pre-Trial Brief and Request for Extension Time-Limit to File Defence Pre-

Trial Brief" filed on 14 July 2004 by the Defence of Franko Simatović (collectively, "Responses"),

NOTING that the Responses indicate that the Defence of the two accused do not oppose the

Motion, but that they request the Trial Chamber to allow a period of 5 months, from the filing of

the Prosecution pre-trial brief, to file their respective pre-trial briefs in the event the Motion is

granted,

NOTING that the Practice Direction on the Length of Briefs and Motions of the International

Tribunal ("Practice Direction") provides that "the pre-trial briefs will not exceed 50 pages or

15,000 words, whichever is greater," and that a party "must seek authorisation in advance from the

Chamber to exceed the page limits in this Practice Direction and must provide an explanation of the

exceptional circumstances that necessitate the oversized filing,"<sup>3</sup>

**NOTING** that the reasons set out in the Motion for the request to exceed the page limit include,

inter alia, the fact that the Prosecution pre-trial brief involves two accused and the crimes charged

are "broad in both their temporal and geographic scope,"

**NOTING** that the pre-trial Judge, pursuant to Rule 65 *ter* of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal ("Rules"), ordered the Prosecution to file its pre-trial brief by Monday, 19 July 2004,<sup>5</sup>

**NOTING** that a date for the Defence of the two accused, to file their respective pre-trial briefs, has not been set by the pre-trial Judge,<sup>6</sup>

**CONSIDERING** that the present case is against two accused and that it covers crimes allegedly committed during a 4 year period in regions in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Croatia,

**CONSIDERING** that it is necessary for the parties to have adequate time to produce their pre-trial briefs in preparation for trial,

PURSUANT TO Rules 54 and 65 ter of the Rules and the Practice Directions

### HEREBY GRANTS the Motion and ORDERS as follows:

- (1) Prosecution shall file its pre-trial brief of no more than 100 pages by Monday, 19 July 2004; and
- (2) Defence of the two accused shall file their respective pre-trial briefs by Monday, 15 November 2004.
