THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal"),

Proprio motu,

NOTING the "Decision on Motion for Judgement of Acquittal", issued by the Trial Chamber on 16 June 2004 ("Decision"), in which it held, *inter alia*, that there was "no or insufficient evidence to support certain allegations relevant to some of the charges in the Indictments",¹

CONSIDERING that it would be appropriate for the Prosecution to identify those parts of the three Indictments (Croatia, Bosnia and Kosovo) which are effected by the Decision,

PURSUANT to Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal,

HEREBY ORDERS the Prosecution to file, within 21 days, a red-lined version of the three Indictments showing the effect of the Decision upon them.
