THE APPEALS CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991,

BEING SEISED OF the "Prosecution's Urgent Motion for the Admission of Rebuttal Evidence", filed confidentially by the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") on 27 July 2004 ("Motion"), in which the Prosecution asks the Appeals Chamber to admit a report by Paško Ljubičić, dated 26 November 1993, concerning the activities of the HVO Military Police in Central Bosnia throughout 1993 ("Report");

NOTING that the Motion is limited to the Report;

CONSIDERING that the Report is in part repetitive to evidence that is already before the Appeals Chamber, and is in part vague, unspecific and merely the expression of an isolated opinion;

CONSIDERING that the Appellant Tihomir Blaškić is not prejudiced by the fact that he was not given a deadline to respond to the Motion;

HEREBY REJECTS the Motion.
