THE APPEALS CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“International Tribunal”),

NOTING Rule 117(D) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal;

NOTING that for reasons of authorised Tribunal business, Judge Pocar is unable to sit on the date scheduled for the delivery of the Judgement in the present case;


NOTING that, pursuant to Rule 15*bis*(A) of the Rules, where a Judge, for reasons of authorised Tribunal business, is unable to continue sitting in a partially heard case for a period that is likely to be of short duration, and the remaining Judges of the Chamber are satisfied that it is in the interests of justice to do so, those remaining Judges of the Chamber may order that the hearing of the case continue in the absence of that Judge for a period of not more than five working days;

CONSIDERING that the remaining Judges of the Appeals Chamber are satisfied that it is in the interests of justice for the hearing to continue, and for the Appeals Chamber’s Judgement to be delivered in Judge Pocar’s absence;

HEREBY ORDERS that a public hearing shall be held on 4 February 2005 at 4:00 p.m. in Courtroom I to deliver the judgement.
