
9:00 a.m. – 9:10 a.m.	Introductory statement by the Presiding Judge;

DIRECTS the parties to prepare themselves in such a way as not simply to recount what has been set out in their written submissions, but to confine their oral arguments to elaborating on points relevant to this appeal that they wish to bring to the Appeals Chamber’s attention, and

ORDERS the Prosecution to file a public redacted version of its Respondent’s Brief by no later than 26 May 2005.
