NOTING the “Scheduling Order for a Hearing on Referral of a Case under Rule 11 bis” of 15 April 2005.

NOTING the Notice provided by the Defence of the willingness of Serbia and Montenegro to accept the cases of Savo Todović and Mitar Rašević, filed by the Defence on 5 May 2005 and 6 May 2005, respectively;


NOTING the submission of Serbia and Montenegro on 7 May 2005 and *corrigendum* on 8 May 2005 requesting referral of the cases of Savo Todović and Mitar Rašević to Serbia and Montenegro, requesting invitation to submit further written submissions, and requesting invitation to the hearing scheduled for 12 May 2005;

NOTING the Prosecution’s response to the notice provided by Serbia and Montenegro and motion to strike the submission of Serbia and Montenegro, both of 10 May 2005;

DETERMINES that there is no need at this time to decide any issues presented by the referenced notices and submissions, that issues raised therein will be addressed at the scheduled hearing, and that representatives of Serbia and Montenegro may attend the hearing when these issues are addressed.

REQUESTS the Registrar to transmit this order immediately to the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Government of Serbia and Montenegro.
