**DECISION TO ALLOW MIRKO NORAC TO TAKE HIS  
EXAMINATION AT THE FACULTY OF KINESIOLOGY**

**TRIAL CHAMBER I** (“the Chamber”) of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991;

**BEING SEIZED OF** a request from the Ministry of Justice of the Republic of Croatia, in the form of a letter signed by The Assistant to the Minister of Justice and filed on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2005, to allow Mr. Mirko Norac, to take his final examination at the Faculty of Kinesiology with the University of Zagreb during one afternoon in May 2005;

**NOTING** that Mr. Mirko Norac is currently imprisoned in the Glina Penitentiary in the Republic of Croatia serving a sentence of 12 years imprisonment imposed on him by a Croatian Court;

**NOTING** the Chamber’s Decision of 8<sup>th</sup> July 2004, which stipulates, *i.a.*, that that the Accused does not leave the prison in which he is detained without the express consent of the Chamber;

**NOTING** that the Croatian Government has assured that Mr. Mirko Norac will be escorted during his exit to the Faculty of Kinesiology and back again;


**CONSIDERING** that it is not incompatible with the purposes for which Mr. Mirko Norac is detained on behalf of the Tribunal to allow him to improve his qualifications and take an exam;

**PURSUANT** to Rule 54;

**HEREBY CONSENTS** to the request made by the Ministry of Justice of the Republic of Croatia to allow Mr. Mirko Norac to exit the Glina Penitentiary for one day, to be determined by the relevant Croatian authorities, for the purpose of taking his exam at the Faculty of Kinesiology with the University of Zagreb, provided he is escorted at all times during the transport and the exam by police officers and that he is being brought back to the Glina Penitentiary immediately after his exam.
