TRIAL CHAMBER I, SECTION A, (“Trial Chamber”) of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“the Tribunal”);

NOTING that the trial proceedings in this case adjourned on 14 July 2005, with the close of the Defence case;

NOTING the “Decision on Motion for Certification”, issued by the Trial Chamber on 30 June 2005, whereby the Trial Chamber granted certification for interlocutory appeal of its decision to admit into evidence the record of the interview of Sefer Halilović with representatives of the Prosecution, which took place from 11 October 2001 to 12 December 2001 (“record of interview with the Accused”);¹

NOTING that the Trial Chamber ordered during the hearing of 14 July 2005 that the final briefs be filed by 22 August 2005 and the closing arguments be heard on 25 and 26 August 2005; and noted that, depending on the date of issuance of the Appeals Chamber’s decision on the admission of the record of interview with the Accused, the date for the filing of the final briefs and the hearing of the closing arguments could be postponed;²

NOTING that the Appeals Chamber’s decision has not been rendered yet, but is expected in due course;



- 2) Closing arguments shall be heard beginning on Monday, 29 August 2005, with each Party permitted 3.5 hours in which to present its argument, and 30 minutes for rebuttal or rejoinder arguments, if any.
