I, THEODOR MERON, President of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”),

NOTING the “Decision on Review of Indictment and Order for Non-Disclosure” in *Prosecutor v. Josep Jović* (“Accused”), rendered on 12 September 2005, in which the Confirming Judge found that there are sufficient grounds to proceed against Josep Jović for contempt on the basis of Rule 77(A), 77(A)(ii), and 77(A)(iv) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Tribunal;


NOTING that Rule 19 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Tribunal authorizes the President of the Tribunal to coordinate the work of the Chambers;
