**THIS TRIAL CHAMBER** of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”);

**BEING SEISED** of a “Sreten Lukić’s Motion, Pursuant to Rule 54 *bis* for a Binding Order Directed to Serbia-Montenegro for Production of Documents”, filed 17 May 2006 (“Motion”);

**NOTING** “Serbia and Montenegro’s Response Relating to the Sreten Lukić’s Motion, Pursuant to Rule 54 *bis*, for a Binding Order Directed to Serbia and Montenegro for Production of Documents”, filed 2 June 2006;

**NOTING** the “Scheduling Order for Further Filings and Hearing on Lukić Motion Pursuant to Rule 54 *bis*”, issued 21 June 2006, ordering the Lukić Defence and the Republic of Serbia to make further filings in this matter and tentatively scheduling a hearing on the Motion for 6 July 2006;


**CONSIDERING** that a hearing on the Motion would be of assistance to the Trial Chamber in the determination of this matter;

**PURSUANT TO** Article 29 of the Statute of the Tribunal and Rules 54 and 54 *bis* of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence;

**HEREBY ORDERS** as follows:

1. The Republic of Serbia shall file its sur-reply (if any) by Tuesday, 4 July 2006.
2. A hearing on the Motion shall be held on Thursday, 6 July 2006 at 2:15 p.m., at which the Lukić Defence and a representative of the Republic of Serbia shall address the Chamber.
