I, JUDGE ALPHONS ORIE, Presiding Judge in Trial Chamber I (“Chamber”) of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”);

RECALLING the *subpoena ad testificandum* issued by the Chamber on 8 June 2006, ordering Branko Đerić to appear as a witness in the case of *Prosecutor v. Momčilo Krajišnik* on Monday 26 June 2006 at 09.00 hours, or to show good cause why he could not comply with the subpoena;

RECALLING the arrest warrant issued by me on 27 June 2006 to the competent authorities of Bosnia and Herzegovina authorizing and requesting them inter alia to search for, arrest, detain, and surrender to the Tribunal **BRANKO ĐERIĆ**, born on 20 November 1948, Srpskih Ratnika BB, Pale, Republika Srpska, Bosnia and Herzegovina, former Prime Minister of Republika Srpska;


CONSIDERING that Branko Đerić initiated contact today with the Chamber, expressing his willingness to testify in the case *Prosecutor v. Momčilo Krajišnik* as a Chamber witness, and to come to The Hague voluntarily;

CONSIDERING that the Victims and Witnesses Section of the Tribunal, upon the instructions of the Chamber, is making the necessary arrangements for Branko Đerić’s travel to, and accommodation in, The Hague;

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS

REQUEST the competent authorities of Bosnia and Herzegovina to **SUSPEND** execution of the above-mentioned arrest warrant until further notice.
