THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”),

BEING SEIZED of a “Second Motion of the Accused Josip Jović for Postponement of Trial,” filed confidentially on 30 June 2006 (“Motion”), which again seeks to postpone the trial in the present case for a period of three months in order for the Accused to care for his wife,


CONSIDERING the oral submissions made by counsel for the Accused Josip Jović at the hearing held on 3 July 2006, in the absence of the Accused himself,

NOTING the oral decision rendered by the Trial Chamber at the hearing held on 3 July 2006, postponing the commencement of the trial until Tuesday 11 July 2006, at 8:00 a.m., at which time the Accused is required to be present,

PURSUANT TO Rule 54 of the Rules,

HEREBY DENIES the Motion, and **ORDERS** that the trial in the present case shall commence on Tuesday 11 July, 2006, at 8.00 a.m., at which time the Accused shall be present.
