1. The Trial Chamber notes that the particular circumstances of the Protected Witness that support the Prosecution's request for this protective measure are set out in Annex A. The Chamber considers that the Prosecution has satisfied its burden of demonstrating that the requested protective measure should be granted, and notes that the Defence teams have indicated that there are no objections to the protective measure sought in the Motion.

2. The Chamber also notes that pursuant to Rule 75 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Tribunal ("Rules"), the other protective measures previously granted in connection with this witness shall remain in force.<sup>1</sup>

3. Pursuant to Rules 54 and 75 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, the Trial Chamber **HEREBY ORDERS** as follows:

- (a) Witness K73 may testify with the use of image distortion.
- (b) The Registrar is directed to make all the necessary arrangements to ensure that this protective measure is in place for the testimony of this witness.
