DECISION ON DEFENCE SUBMISSION REGARDING DEFENCE WITNESSES

TRIAL CHAMBER I ("Trial Chamber") of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal");

BEING SEISED of the "Defence Submission Regarding Defence Witnesses", filed *confidentially* on 23 August 2006 ("Defence Submission"), wherein the Defence submits that "Witness MM-097 has died recently", that "the Defence was unable to make contact with Witnesses MM-115, MM-122, MM-123 and MM-130 regarding their testimony in the instant proceedings," and that the witnesses "should, therefore, be dropped from the witness list";¹

CONSIDERING that the Defence Submission must be understood as a request pursuant to Rule 73 *ter* (D) of the Rules to amend the Defence's 65 *ter* (G) witness list by withdrawing Witnesses MM-097, MM-115, MM-122, MM-123 and MM-130;

CONSIDERING that as a result of the Defence not being able to contact Witnesses MM-115, MM-122, MM-123 and MM-130, it has been unable to provide the Trial Chamber with, on the one hand, summaries of the expected testimony of the witnesses that meet the requirements of Rule 65 *ter* (G)(i), and, on the other hand, with reliable estimates of the time needed for their testimony;

NOTING the Defence submission that the initial interviews with Witnesses MM-115, MM-122, MM-123 and MM-130 took place several years ago;²

CONSIDERING that it is in the interests of justice to grant the Defence Submission;

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS,

PURSUANT TO Rule 73 ter of the Rules,

GRANTS the Defence Submission.
