TRIAL CHAMBER III ("Chamber") of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal"),

CONSIDERING that the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") moved for the admission of 13 documents¹ relating to the testimony of Witness Mufida Likić ("Proposed Exhibits"), who appeared before the Chamber on 21 March 2007,

PURSUANT TO Rules 54 and 89 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence,

GRANTS the motions of the Prosecution,

DECIDES that there are grounds to admit into evidence the documents labelled "admitted" in the Annex attached to this decision.
