ORDER ON PROSECUTION REQUEST FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE SIXTH PROGRESS REPORT

THE REFERRAL BENCH of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal");

BEING SEIZED of the "Prosecutor's Request for an Extension of Time to File Sixth Progress Report" ("Request"), filed by the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") on 27 April 2007, wherein the Prosecution requested an extension of time, until 14 May 2007, in which to file its sixth report on the progress made by the Prosecutor of Bosnia and Herzegovina in the prosecution of Gojko Janković ("Sixth Progress Report"), pursuant to the Referral Bench's "Decision on Referral of Case Under Rule 11*bis*" of 22 July 2005 ("Decision");

NOTING that in the Decision the Prosecution was ordered to file a report every three months which was to include information on the course of the proceedings against Gojko Janković before the State Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the report of the international organisation monitoring or reporting on such proceedings¹;

NOTING the Prosecutor's fifth progress report ("Fifth Progress Report") which was filed on 1 February 2007;

NOTING that the Prosecution's Sixth Progress Report was due to be filed, pursuant to the Decision, three months after the filing of the Fifth Progress Report, *i.e.*, no later than 1 May 2007;

CONSIDERING that the submissions set forth by the Prosecution in support of the Request to be amply justified and reasonable since the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe's monitoring report would not be available before 7 May 2007;

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS

PURSUANT to Rules 11bis, 54, 73 and 127(A)(i) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence,

GRANTS the Prosecution's Request for an extension of time in which to file its Sixth Progress Report;

ORDERS the Prosecution to file its Sixth Progress Report no later than Monday, 14 May 2007.
