THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal");

NOTING the "Prosecution's Motion for Joinder of Accused", filed by the Prosecution on 6 June 2007 ("Joinder Motion"), in which the Prosecution requests an order joining *Prosecutor v. Tolimir* with *Prosecutor v. Popović et al.*;

NOTING that in the Joinder Motion, the Prosecution further requests that all deadlines and timetables associated with the motion be suspended until a counsel is assigned to Tolimir;¹

NOTING that on 13 June 2007 several of the Accused raised concerns with respect to the requested joinder;²

NOTING that on 15 June 2007 the Trial Chamber issued an oral order by which time limits for filing responses to the Joinder Motion were suspended;³

NOTING that on 18 June 2007, the Pre-Trial Judge in *Prosecutor v. Tolimir* issued an "Order Suspending Time Limit for Filing Response to Prosecution Joinder Motion", which suspended the time for Tolimir to file a response to the Joinder Motion until a further order is issued;

NOTING the Request submitted on 26 June 2007 by Tolimir ("Request"), in which he asks the Trial Chamber to dismiss the Joinder Motion because (i) joinder would prolong the proceedings in the case of *Prosecutor v. Popović et al.* "and render them uncertain and complex",⁴ and (ii) his state of health may not allow him to "prepare an adequate defence in a short period of time",⁵ and in which he adds that additional reasons for dismissing the Joinder Motion will be submitted after a permanent counsel has been assigned to him;⁶

NOTING that on 27 June 2007, the Trial Chamber informed the Accused of Tolimir's request to dismiss the Joinder Motion,⁷ and that on 28 June 2007 Tolimir's request was also filed in *Prosecutor v. Popović et al.;*
