The Trial Chamber rendered a majority decision dated 31 January 2008 on the admission of evidence related to Witness DZ in which it rejected evidence presented by several Defence teams. A majority of the Trial Chamber Judges rejected Exhibits 1D 01595 and 1D 01936 for the reasons explained in the annex attached to the decision. I consider that these exhibits should have been admitted.

Consistent with my previously stated opinions on the same subject,¹ I consider that the admission of exhibits is not governed solely by the "exchange" a witness may give about an exhibit in the *inter partes* hearing.

Exhibit 1D 01595

This document is a transcript of a meeting held on 18 May 1993 in Medugorje among several participants, including President Tudjman, Lord Owen, Mr Stoltenberg, internationals as well as Croatian and Muslim officials, to discuss the modalities for peace negotiations. Since this document was discussed in court, its content is particularly relevant in that it concerns the political context and the joint criminal enterprise alleged in the Indictment. Moreover, this document seems to be corroborated by other documents tendered into the record and thus offers indicia of reliability.

Exhibit 1D 01936

This document is an undated letter from Haris SILAJDŽIĆ, Minister of Foreign Affairs, to President IZETBEGOVIĆ and to other personalities about a joint declaration and its implementation. The Chamber has already had many documents on this subject which support this document in terms of its relevance, reliability and probative value.
