THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons

Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory

of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal") is seised of "Sreten Lukic's Third Motion to

Amend Rule 65 ter Exhibit List with Annex A," filed 14 February 2008 ("Motion"), and hereby

issues this decision thereon.

1. In the Motion, the Lukić Defence seeks to add documents to its Rule 65 ter exhibit list on

the basis that they were found and discovered to be relevant and essential during the preparation of

witnesses to be called by the Lukić Defence. The Defence argues that the documents are relevant

to the trial, indispensable for the presentation of the defence case, and that their addition to the list

would serve the interests of justice.

2. The Prosecution has indicated that it does not intend to respond to the Motion.

3. The Chamber notes that all of the documents are currently pending translation. The Lukić

Defence is reminded that it must submit English translations of these documents for them to be

tendered as evidence in the case.

4. Accordingly, the Trial Chamber, pursuant to Rules 54 and 65 ter of the Rules of Procedure

and Evidence of the Tribunal, hereby GRANTS the Motion.
