THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons

Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory

of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal") ex proprio motu issues this order in relation to

exhibits P1468 and IC199.

1. During the evidence of Milan Đaković, a witness called by the Trial Chamber, illegible

portions of P1468 (a copy of a notebook containing notes hand-written by the witness) were

clarified in a new document (IC199), which was translated into English by the Conference and

Language Services Section, and then uploaded to eCourt. On 21 May 2008, the Chamber directed

the parties to reach agreement (if possible) and submit a joint filing on how this evidence should be

handled.

2. Thus far, the Chamber has not received such a joint filing from the parties.

3. Accordingly, the Trial Chamber, pursuant to Rule 54 and 89 of the Rules of Procedure and

Evidence of the Tribunal, hereby ORDERS that the parties shall, by no later than Thursday,

12 June 2008, jointly file submissions (if possible) on the manner in which IC199 should be treated

in relation to P1468 and whether the former should be admitted into evidence.

4. Should the parties not be able to come to agreement upon this matter, the Chamber will

issue a decision thereon on Friday, 13 June 2008.
