INVITATION TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

<u>The Accused</u> Mr. Radovan Karadžić Standby Counsel Mr. Richard Harvey **THIS TRIAL CHAMBER** of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal"),

BEING SEISED of the Accused's "Second Motion for Binding Order: United States of America", filed on 7 December 2010 ("Motion"), whereby the Accused requests the Trial Chamber to issue a binding order pursuant to Article 29 of the Statute of the Tribunal and Rule 54 *bis* of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Tribunal ("Rules") requiring the United States of America ("U.S.") to produce documents pertaining to the shipment of arms in 1995 to the Bosnian Muslims at Tuzla;¹

NOTING that, in the Motion, the Accused requests the Chamber to order the production of: (i) those portions of the report of an investigation conducted by the "Intelligence Oversight Board"² in 1994-1995 concerning allegations of U.S. government personnel assisting in the supply of arms to the Bosnian Muslims at Tuzla in February-March 1995 ("IOB Report"), and (ii) the transcript of a U.S. House of Representatives Select Subcommittee deposition of Richard Holbrooke taken on 27 September 1996 ("Holbrooke deposition");³

NOTING that, on 7 December 2010, the U.S. submitted a "Letter to the Trial Chamber from the Unites States Regarding 'Accused's Second Motion for a Binding Order: United States of America'" ("Letter"), in which it requests the Accused to amend or withdraw his Motion and, if not, requests the Trial Chamber to grant the U.S. until 10 January 2011 to file its response;⁴

NOTING that, on 14 December 2010, the Accused filed a "Reply to Letter from the United States" ("Reply"), in which he expresses his willingness to withdraw the request for the IOB Report if a U.S. government official with the appropriate security clearance certifies that the report does not contain information about "events in Tuzla";⁵ withdraws his request for the Holbrooke deposition

following the death of Richard Holbrooke on 13 December 2010;⁶ and states that he is still awaiting documents previously requested from the U.S. pertaining to arms shipments to Tuzla;⁷

CONSIDERING that it is in the interests of all parties involved that requests for documents are, if possible, dealt with on a voluntary basis;

PURSUANT TO Rule 54 of the Rules,

HEREBY INVITES the U.S. to file its response to the Accused's Motion and Reply by 10 January 2011.
