I, HOWARD MORRISON, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”),

HAVING designated myself as pre-trial Judge in this matter,¹

NOTING the Initial Appearance of the accused in this case held on 21 September 2010, at which the accused pled not guilty,


NOTING Rule 65 bis (A) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Tribunal (“Rules”), pursuant to which a status conference shall be convened (i) to organise exchanges between the parties and (ii) to review the status of the case and to allow the accused the opportunity to raise issues in relation thereto, including her mental and physical condition,

PURSUANT TO Rule 65 *bis* of the Rules,

HEREBY ORDER

- (a) that a status conference shall be held on Friday 4 February 2011 commencing at 10 a.m. in Courtroom 1; and
- (b) the Defence shall, no later than Monday 31 January 2011, either confirm that the accused will be present or provide written consent of the accused pursuant to Rule 65 *bis* (C)(ii) for the status conference to be conducted in her absence.
