THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons

Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the

Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal");

BEING SEISED OF the Accused's "Motion for Invitation to Government of Spain: Interview

of Captain Jose Grande", filed on 16 September 2011 ("Motion"), whereby the Accused

requests the Chamber to issue an invitation, pursuant to Article 29 of the Statute of the Tribunal

("Statute") to the Government of Spain ("Spain") to facilitate an interview with Captain Jose

Grande by his legal advisor;<sup>1</sup>

NOTING that in the Motion the Accused submits that Captain Grande was part of the

UNPROFOR team that investigated the shelling of the Markale market on 5 February 1994,<sup>2</sup>

which is why the Accused now seeks to interview him and may eventually decide to call him as

a witness in his case;<sup>3</sup>

NOTING that, on 26 May 2011, the Accused filed a letter with the United Nations, requesting

that the UN waive the applicable privileges and immunities enjoyed by Captain Grande and

permit him to be interviewed by his legal advisor;<sup>4</sup>

**NOTING** that, on 6 July 2011, the UN granted the Accused's request under specific conditions

but stated that the UN Department of Peacekeeping Operations no longer had the contact

information for Captain Grande;<sup>5</sup>

NOTING that, on 12 July 2011, the Accused sent a letter to Spain stating that the UN had given

him permission to interview Captain Grande and requesting Spain to locate and contact him in

order to facilitate an interview by his legal advisor;<sup>6</sup>

**NOTING** that, on 31 August 2011, after receiving no response, the Accused sent another letter

to Spain reiterating his previous request and stating that if he did not receive a reply within ten

days, he would file a motion for a binding order to compel Spain to co-operate;<sup>7</sup>

NOTING further the Accused's submission that he never received a response from Spain in

relation to his request;8

CONSIDERING that, as of 19 September 2011, the Accused has not yet received a response

from Spain regarding his request to interview Captain Grande nor has he received the contact

information for Captain Grande;

CONSIDERING that it would be beneficial to hear from Spain on this issue, should Spain wish

to respond;

CONSIDERING that the Accused does not have Captain Grande's contact information and

thus was unable to contact him directly;

CONSIDERING also that Captain Grande should be made aware of the Accused's Motion in

order to allow him to respond to the Accused directly, or to the Chamber, should he wish to do

so;

**PURSUANT TO** Article 29 of the Statute,

**HEREBY:** 

(a) **INVITES** Spain to respond the Motion within 14 days from the receipt of this

Invitation, and requests that it immediately inform Captain Jose Grande about its

existence; and

(b) **REQUESTS** the Registry to provide the Motion and this Invitation to Spain.
