THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”);

BEING SEISED of the “Request for Reclassification of Filings Relating to Indigence Decision” filed confidentially and *ex parte* by the Accused on 9 December 2014 (“Request”), wherein the Accused requests that nine filings related to the litigation on the Accused’s indigence as listed in confidential and *ex parte* Annex A to the Request (“Filings”) be reclassified as public;

NOTING the “Deputy Registrar’s Submission Regarding Karadžić’s Motion for Reclassification of Filings Relating to Indigence Decision” filed confidentially and *ex parte* on 9 January 2015, wherein the Deputy Registrar does not oppose the Request;


CONSIDERING that it is in the interests of justice and of a public trial that the Filings be reclassified as public;
