
ORDERS that the following blacked-out text appearing at transcript page 61, line 12, be omitted from the public transcript and be edited from the public broadcast of the hearing dated 2 September 2015.

9 JUDGE MERON: Thank you, Mr. Čorić.
10 Counsel for Mr. Pušić. We are going to Sarajevo now.
11 MR. IBERIMOVIC: (Interpretation) [Via videolink] Your Honour, as
12 you know, [REDACTED] information about his
13 health is strictly confidential, and we have no need to raise any issue
14 in connection with this.
15 JUDGE MERON: Thank you. I understand there is no need for me to
16 close the session. Thank you very much.
17 I shall now turn to an update of the case. All of the
18 appellants' briefs in this case were filed on 12 January 2015 and all of
19 the Defence and Prosecution respondents' briefs were filed on 7 May 2015.
20 The Defence and Prosecution's reply briefs were filed on 29 May 2015.
21 I note that all of the respondents' briefs were filed
22 confidentially. Public redacted versions of the appeals briefs and the
23 response briefs were filed by 29 July and 19 August 2015 respectively.
24 Public redacted versions of the reply briefs are due on 9 September 2015.
25 Mr. Petković and Mr. Pušić, however, have not yet filed public redacted
