## **DECISION IN RELATION TO EXHIBIT P5279**

Mr Branko Lukić Mr Miodrag Stojanović **TRIAL CHAMBER I** of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Chamber" and "Tribunal", respectively);

**BEING SEISED** of the Prosecution request communicated by email on 25 August 2016, seeking the replacement of exhibit P5279, a log book of the 1st Krajina Corps, with a revised version containing an additional page ("Request");

**NOTING** the Prosecution submission that it only recently discovered that the additional page was inadvertently excluded when the document was uploaded into eCourt;

**NOTING** that on 29 August 2016, the Defence objected and opposed the Request ("Objection"), submitting that the final stage for the Prosecution to bring new documents would have been rebuttal;<sup>1</sup>

**NOTING** that on 5 September 2016, the Prosecution responded to the Objection, submitting that it seeks to address an oversight made earlier in the case, not to tender new or rebuttal evidence;<sup>2</sup>

**CONSIDERING** that the Chamber closed the Prosecution's case on 26 February 2014;<sup>3</sup>

**CONSIDERING** that the Prosecution's in-court witnesses during the re-opening of its case-inchief were heard between 22 June and 8 July 2015;<sup>4</sup>

**CONSIDERING** that Rule 85 of the Tribunal's Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("Rules") sets out the sequence of presentation of evidence;
