1. On 26 May 2014, the Prosecution requested the Trial Chamber to declare 17 witnesses as expert witnesses and to admit into evidence without cross-examination five reports of expert witnesses.¹ On 10 June 2014, counsel for Mr. Salim Jamil Ayyash, Mr. Mustafa Amine Badreddine, Mr. Hassan Habib Merhi and Mr. Hussein Hassan Oneissi submitted their responses to the Prosecution's motion under Rule 161 of the Special Tribunal's Rules of Procedure and Evidence.²

2. On 6 June 2014, the Prosecution filed its notice of proposed witness order for trial hearings in June and July 2014.³ This notice includes eight expert witnesses the Prosecution intends to call in July.⁴ This order relates to those eight witnesses.

3. Before deciding the admissibility of the reports the Trial Chamber requires further information and clarification from the Prosecution:

- (i) Nine co-authors have signed the report R91-602843.⁵ The Prosecution, however, has submitted a detailed *curriculum vitae* of only one co-author of the report, Witness PRH155. The information submitted by the Prosecution in relation to the remaining co-authors appears to be insufficient for the Trial Chamber to determine whether the co-authors possess the requisite expertise to provide the expert opinions and conclusions in the report. The Trial Chamber orders the Prosecution to submit further biographical information in relation to the co-authors of that report.
- (ii) The Prosecution stated that it does not rely upon the entirety of report R91-602843.⁶ However, the Prosecution's explanation as to which sections of the report it intends to rely on are unclear. The Trial Chamber orders the Prosecution to clarify in a comprehensible form what specific sections of the report R91-602843 are being relied upon and what sections are not.

(iii) The *curriculum vitae* submitted by the Prosecution for its proposed expert witness PRH348⁷ provides insufficient information about the educational background and professional experience for the Trial Chamber to determine whether the witness is an expert or a witness of fact. **The Trial Chamber orders** the Prosecution to provide further biographical information for this witness.
