ORDER TO THE ONEISSI DEFENCE REGARDING TWO DOCUMENTS SOUGHT FOR ADMISSION INTO EVIDENCE

- 1. On 21 November 2017, counsel for the Accused, Mr Hussein Hassan Oneissi, filed an application requesting the Trial Chamber to admit into evidence exhibits 4D357 MFI (a filtered landline call sequence table, entitled 'Filtered OTP ECT/CST/0123'), 4D363 MFI (a document listing a selection of calls of mobiles allegedly attributed to Oneissi family members) and 4D364 MFI (maps of movements of mobiles in the period December 2004 February 2005).²
- 2. It is in the interests of justice and expeditiousness of the proceedings that counsel for Mr Oneissi provide, in support of the *prima facie* reliability and, accordingly, probative value of exhibits 4D357 MFI and 4D363 MFI, the statement(s) of the creator(s) of these two documents. This would also allow the Prosecution to reproduce and verify them.
- 3. The Trial Chamber therefore orders counsel for Mr Oneissi to provide, by 1 December 2017, the statement(s) of the person(s) who created exhibits 4D357 MFI and 4D363 MFI. The Trial Chamber urges the Parties to cooperate so as to reach an agreement on the admissibility of the documents.
